RE: Announcement of Park Locations Permitting Dog Access

Beginning Sunday, October 1, the City of Logan will permit dogs off leash in Rendezvous Park (1500 South U.S. Highway 89-91) and the Harris Park and Nature Preserve at Dry Canyon (east end of Mountain Road in Logan).

On leash locations include the Logan/Cache County Fairgrounds, Bonneville Shoreline Trail (Logan City Limit to parking lot at First Dam), Logan River Trail (approximately 700 S. Riverwalk Drive to 1000 West along the Logan River), and the Deer Fence Trail (mouth of Dry Canyon to Providence City Limits).

Dog owners are reminded that on days of special events the Logan/Cache County Fairgrounds will post "NO DOGS ALLOWED" signs at all entrances in compliance with the new Animal Ordinance. 6.12.220 of the Animal Ordinance prohibits dogs from entering upon premises during public assemblies.

The permitted locations will be signed by October 1. Dog owners should obtain the latest brochure produced by the Logan City Police Department which provides information about commonly asked questions about the City animal ordinance.

In addition to this information, Denzil Stewart Nature Park in Logan is not currently a permitted on-leash or off-leash location for dogs. Park improvements and plans for the re-alignment of the Providence Canal through the nature park will preclude decisions to permit dog access until construction is complete next summer at which time the Parks and Recreation Citizens Advisory Board will determine adding the park to the access list.
